CON ARTISTS ARE MASTERS OF TRUST

You can learn a lot about trust from the people who violate it for a living. "A hood planning a bank holdup might case the treasury for rudimentary facts, but in the end he depends on his gun. A con artist's only weapon is his brain," says celebrity con man Frank Abagnale, author of the memoir *Catch Me If You Can*. So what do Abagnale and other con artists know that you don't? For starters, how to earn the confidence of strangers in seconds flat.

Numerous studies show that mirroring body language increases empathy. It makes salesmen more likely to close deals, and it allows con men to build subconscious bonds with their victims.

Mirroring creates a feeling of familiarity and belonging, and most importantly to scammers, it breaks down mental defenses by allowing access to their victims' physical space.

And speech can be manipulated just as effectively as body language to build a quick sense of familiarity between scammer and victim.

BRTA NOVEMBER MINUTES

The Boone County Retired Teachers met at Immanuel Lutheran Church on November 21, 2023 at 10 am. Thirty-two members and two guests were present.

President Kathy Prindiville called the meeting to order with members reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Margaret Osbakken gave the invocation with a poem by Chief Yellow Hawk, and then she read Native American narratives. Margaret concluded with leading BRTA members in prayer.

Following the brunch, President Prindiville thanked the Immanuel servers for the meal.

The Secretary's minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Treasurer, Mark Luthin, reported there is \$1,970.45 in the checking account, not including \$28 of dues paid in November. The Scholarship fund has \$3,431.36, including \$144 collected in the October School Bus.

Committee Reports:

Mark Luthin, Membership, reported there are 176 members, with 23 being Life Members and 153 dues paying.

Val Graham, Scholarship, stated she would be needing volunteers to sign up to read the 2024 scholarship applications.

Mary Lang, Legislative, had a three -part report including correspondence at the National level to U.S. Rep Darin LaHood concerning a possible government shutdown and an assault weapons bill. Rep. LaHood would not commit to how he would vote, if the bill came up for a vote. Correspondence went to Sen. Dick Durbin concerning the military promotion hold up. A resolution to consider military nominations in a group was referred to the Senate Rules Committee. At the State level bills that had passed were reported on. Third, Mary also updated members on the Social Security Fairness Act.

Mary's report was very informative, and the full report can be read on the website.

Gail Davidson, Community Participation, reported the April 16, 2024 BRTA meeting is tentatively set to be at the First United Methodist Church. April plans are yet to be finalized. President Prindiville thanked all the officers and committee chairmen for their work during her term as president.

CO-VP, Vivian Penny introduced AMBA Advisors Steve Huber and Nancy Perlman who presented a most timely program, "Aging in Place." AMBA will do personalized meetings to help members with this process, if it is their desire.
